Roots of Words

- Etymology- study of words and the way in which their meanings have changed throughout the history.
- Roots words are the building blocks of words.
- The two most common language sources for word roots in English are Greek and Latin.
- Root is a word or word part which other words grow, usually through prefixes and suffixes.
- Root is the basis of the word, but it cannot stand alone



Examples

| cand | glowing, iridescent | Latin | <pre>candid - free from bias, prejudice, or malice; candle - something that gives light; incandescent - white, glowing, or luminous with intense heat</pre> |

| circum, circle | around, about | Latin | circumference – the distance around; circumscribe – to draw around; circumspect – looking around |
